for your dedicated work as part of the Savannah District Camp Wheeler DERP-FUDDS Work team. Camp Wheeler was established in 1917 as a temporary training camp for National Guard units in Federal service during World War I. It was closed and then reopened during World War II as an Infantry Replacement Training Center where new recruits received basic/advanced individual training to replace combat casualties. The camp was declared excess in 1946, and after a "dedudding" operation in 1946 to remove ordnance from the range, the land was returned to the owners. This project addressed ordnance contamination on 150 residential acres. A total of 338 60 mm mortars (all high explosive) and 10 grenade fuses were found and destroyed by detonation, along with the removal and disposal of 15,648 pounds of munitions debris. The removal action involved extensive field work on private property and in the yards surrounding private residences, requiring extensive and on-going public coordination activities
